ICS-NE Treasurer's Update

The ICS-NE treasury has a current balance of \$4715.38. The only income is from the yearly ICS membership fees, equaling \$430 this year. The only expense was the corporate registry of \$40. In my opinion, with current revenue, spending anything more than \$390 will reduce the reserve below a prudent level. The Tribe is ok, but I would suggest not spending a lot since the Tribe will need some reserve for the next convention, deposits, etc.

The group before me did well with their convention so there was a good cushion for travel expenses. I think there was over \$10K when I took over from the last group. Our last convention (Baltimore 2012) started with \$8139.94 and we lost everything and had to be bailed out by the ICS. Their bailout check was \$4956.32, which I think was half the deficit.

Anyway, generating some additional revenue for our Tribe would be good.
