Tonight is the 2025 Sun 'N Fun Airshow Pilot Briefing on Arrival NOTAM and Ground Operations, presented by Wayne Harris and Mark Fullmer, Co-chairs of SNF

This is an essential briefing for pilots planning to arrive at the 2025 Sun 'N Fun Airshow. Wayne and Mark will guide us through the 2025 arrival NOTAM and ground operations and safety.

Learn the designated arrival route, holds, the standard pattern, and taxiways converted to runways. We'll cover how the landing dots will be used and discuss the pressures pilots may face during arrival. Understanding these details will allow you to plan for a smooth and safe experience.

At one of the world's busiest locations for one week, the goal of Ground Ops is simple: separate propellers from people. This may involve working with both inexperienced volunteers and pilots, making communication and preparation critical. We'll explain how to handle the unique challenges of arriving at Sun 'N Fun, including where to place Ground Ops placards (attached, print in color) for quick and efficient assistance.

Flying down a peninsula with heavy traffic can be stressful at the best of times - add to that a large number of "locals" (aka "crackers") arriving from the south. We'll provide insight on the best strategies to manage your flight path and to interact with local traffic.

Sun 'N Fun has a vast number of parking areas, so it's crucial to understand how to communicate with Ground Ops volunteers, use your placards, and get to the right spot safely.

Unlike Oshkosh, Sun 'N Fun sees a lot of day-trip aircraft. Learn how to handle this influx of traffic and when you can expect to move, plus where to find the latest updates on arrival procedures.
